

Procedures for using spill response kits from Risborg ApS

Oil Only absorbs, among other things, oil, petrol, diesel, crude oil, brake fluid and soap. Remains floating even when saturated. Totally repels water.

Universal absorbs, among other things, oil, petrol, crude oil, water, coolant and solvents.

Chemical absorbs, among other things, oil, petrol, water, acids, bases, chlorine, solvents, coolant and potassium hydroxide.

Personal protective equipment (PPE):

Personal protective equipment may be included in the spill kit (e.g. gloves, goggles, etc.) and must be used regardless of the size or nature of the spill. It is the company's responsibility to check the compatibility of the protective equipment with the liquids to be absorbed.

Absorbent socks:

Absorbent socks should be used to form a temporary containment of the spill. When several socks are used in a continuous length, they should overlap by approx. 30 cm. One sock absorbs approx. 4 liters.

Pillows:

The pillows are used to absorb 4.5 liters of spillage in a confined area or as an ad hoc barrier.

Pads:

The final absorption of a spill should be carried out using absorbent pads. Each pad can absorb approximately 0.8 liters of liquid. The pads must remain in contact with the spill until they are saturated.

Oil Only absorbent floating booms:

The Oil Only absorbent floating booms are used to absorb oil spills in streams, lakes, rivers, waterways, harbors and at sea.

They are equipped with metal hooks and rings, that make it easy to connect several absorbent floating booms together. Ø13cm absorbs approx. 10 liters per meter. Ø20cm absorbs approx. 21 liters per meter.

Oil Only Sweep:

The Oil Only Sweep is suitable for absorbing surface oil on water. It can be secured across a watercourse or pulled by a vessel using the built-in straps. Can be used in conjunction with absorbent floating barriers to complete a clean-up after a spill on water. 30 m absorbs 72 liters.

Disposal:

All spill response kits include waste bags with strips.

It is the company's responsibility to dispose of waste in accordance with applicable local regulations.
